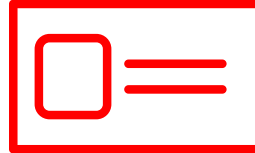
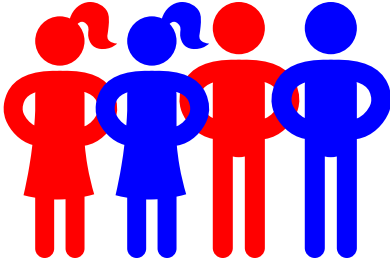




VOTING RIGHTS

OF INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES



THE LAW

There are no restrictions on the right to vote under Colorado Law regarding voters with disabilities. Voters with disabilities have the right to vote as protected by the Help America Vote Act.



IDENTIFICATION

A drivers license is not required to vote. You may also use a Passport, State-Issued ID, a Medicaid or Medicare Card, a bank statement, pay stub, or utility bill that states your name.



ACCESS

Polling Centers must be architecturally accessible, with accessible parking, path to the polling booth, and all entrances. If you feel you will have a hard time reaching a voting machine, let the polling workers know for further assistance.

ALTERNATE BALLOTS

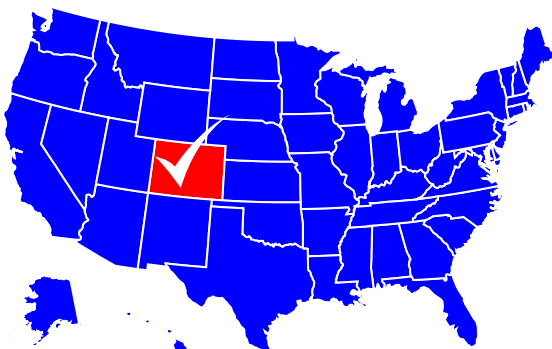
There must be at least one accessible voting machine per location. Registration forms, ballots, and other materials must be available in alternate formats that are accessible, including formats for those with vision impairment.

ASSISTANCE

Assistance with alternate voting formats and explanations on how to cast a vote is available to you while maintaining the right to vote privately and independently. You are allowed to bring an advocate to help you cast your vote.
